
Family Connection / Naviance

Importance of Attendance

- Students who are absent will need to submit a note to the front office to Mrs. Key.
- Excused absences include the following reasons:
 - o Doctor's appointment, illness, death in family, court dates
- Notes must be submitted within two school days. After two days, the absence will be considered unexcused.
- A student may miss no more than three days per year for a purpose determined by parent/guardian. A request must be made in advance in writing to the principal. Planned absences with Principal approval cannot be taken during exams.

Ensuring Academic Integrity

- Academic integrity includes values such as avoidance of cheating or plagiarism; maintenance of high academic standards; honesty and rigor in research, assessment, and day-to-day performance. Obvious violations of this code include such concerns such as cheating and copying. Less obvious violations include failure to cite the sources of information students include in papers or projects and misuse of digital tools and resources.
